AGM Highlights

- \Rightarrow 100 members were in attendance.
- \Rightarrow The Union filed a grievance on behalf of persons in the professorial range. Work is still on-going to resolve this matter.
- ⇒ Complaints were received from members at the Open Campus regarding payment of the Study and Travel Grant.
- ⇒ A Task Force was set-up to examine the governance structure of the Open Campus and to make recommendations. The Task Force conducted focus group sessions with staff members and also received submissions from individuals within and outside of UWI.
- ⇒ A security survey and vulnerability assessment is now underway. The results are expected to strengthen and guide the strategic direction of security on the Mona Campus over the next three (3) to five (5) years.
- \Rightarrow Fifty (50) car duty concession applications were processed and approved. None were denied.
- \Rightarrow A total of 43 WIGUT bursaries were awarded.
- ⇒ Between December 7-18, 2015, a total of J\$30 million was allocated for royalty payment by JAMCOPY.
- \Rightarrow The Union settled and signed-off on the additional items of claim for the 2014-2017 triennium.
- \Rightarrow The Union is monitoring very carefully, the mold mitigation efforts on the Campus.
- ⇒ The Capital Development Fund stood at \$9.4M up from \$6.9M, while the new Welfare Fund stood at \$440,000. The Union's investments at the end of the year stood at \$30.3M up from \$25.4M for the year 2014. The balance in the Student Bursary Fund stood at \$3.4M down from \$6.7 M for the year 2014.
- ⇒ The issuing of the AGM eBook 2016 is a first for WIGUT (Jamaica). It consists of all reports for the various WIGUT Committees presented at the AGM. The eBook was pre-circulated before the AGM.
