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President's Message

Greetings colleagues and comrades-at-arms. As we start another chapter in the annals of the Union, I take this opportunity to congratulate the new executive and representatives appointed at the last AGM. Your willingness to serve is testament to the commitment to continue the noble task of representing the workers of the noble institution and leading the collective voice.

We take this opportunity as well to congratulate The UWI on the recent advancement in ranking to be numbered among the top 1.5% of universities by the Times Higher Education system. This achievement is testament to the dedication, hard work and excellence of colleagues within the Academy, and you can feel justly proud to be a part of that achievement. Clearly, this strengthens our case for due recognition of all of us for parity in salary/emoluments across The UWI system and for competitive packages which line up with our international rankings.

We are in the midst of another round of negotiations and recently we shared with you, via poll, the main counterclaims from The UWI Management. Please take a moment and register your voice, so that we will see how you feel about the unreasonable requests being made from Management, especially at this time.

Recently, I made a presentation at the FSS on the role the Union can play in whistleblowing and the need to protect staff who make reports of malpractice and improprieties at The UWI from victimization. Among the points made included the fact that (1) external disclosure is always an option even if there is a regulator; (2) there is a requirement for the Institution to protect the individual against any retribution; (3) with no whistleblowing policy at The UWI and no clear path for disciplinary action for the (senior) Officers of The UWI, the time has come to ensure that proper systems are in place for The UWI to continue to be "A Light Shining from the West". In other words, The UWI must be a place where that light can shine on workers at all levels in the Academy; where all minds, hearts and paths will be illuminated to the same extent; and that the deeds and actions of all are subject to the same scrutiny and probity. Only then will we have an Academy where trust and ethical behaviour will be experienced across the board.

Colleagues, we are still in the throes of the Covid19 pandemic. I implore you to protect yourselves at all times: we are all vulnerable and susceptible – hence the need for the mask wearing, frequent hand sanitizing, physical distancing, etc. (which addresses vulnerability) and for vaccination (which will address susceptibility). While we might not support mandatory vaccinations, we would strongly encourage all members to make the right decision to deal with their own vulnerability and susceptibility.

Professor Webber is a renowned marine scientist whose significant body of work resulted in her being recognised for her Contributions to Science by the Institute of Jamaica on June 4, 2021.

Promotions to Deanship

The UWI Regional Headquarters, Jamaica on Thursday, May 6, 2021, announced that the appointments of seven new and returning Faculty Deans were approved at the annual business meeting of The University of the West Indies (The UWI) on Friday, April 30, 2021.

Two new female Deans appointed at the Mona Campus, Professor Silvia Kouwenberg in the Faculty of Humanities and Education and Professor Minerva Thame in the Faculty of Medical Sciences also made history as their appointments brought a 50% female representation in deanships at the Campus. The appointment of Professor Thame marks the first female appointment as Dean of the Faculty of Medical Sciences.

These historic appointments of the female Deans come on the heels of The UWI's recognition by the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings in April, for its pursuit of the UN Sustainable Goal on Gender Equality (SDG:5), among other SDGs.

The Deans take office on August 1, 2021 and the WIGUT congratulates Professors Kouwenberg and Thame and welcomes this historic move in the record of The UWI.



Professor Silvia Kouwenberg Dean, Faculty of Humanities and Education

Silvia Kouwenberg is a Professor of Linguistics (from May 2009) in the Department of Language, Linguistics and Philosophy having joined The UWI (Mona Campus) as a Lecturer in October 1991. She was promoted to Senior Lecturer in September 1997 and served as Head of Department from August 2011-July 2014. Her service to the Faculty of Humanities & Education includes duties as Deputy Dean for Undergraduate and Quality Assurance Matters August 2015-July 2018 and Mona Academic Board representative on the UWI Senate. 2012-2017. Professor Kouwenberg has been a member of the Society for Caribbean Linguistics since 1988 and was President for the period 2016-18. Since 2017 she has served on the Editorial Advisory Board of the Contact Language Library.



Professor Minerva Thame Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences

Minerva Thame is a Professor of Perinatal and Paediatric Medicine. She has supervised several graduate theses, published more than 60 publications and is cited by over 1200 scholars. Professor Thame joined the University as Senior Lecturer in February 2005 and most recently served as Director of Graduate Studies and Research for the University. Professor Thame has also served on national and international committees including Regional Consultant for the WHO Integrated Strategy to Promote Optimal Foetal Growth and Development, Vice President and President of the Paediatric Association of Jamaica, and regionally as the Vice President of the Caribbean College of Paediatrics.

The UWI Blue Book and You

Medical Boarding Procedure

The Vice Chancellor or designate, or the Campus Principal or designate, upon receipt of a written report from an employee, Dean, Head of Department, or the Clinical Director of the University Health Centre, or equivalent Officer. that a member of staff:

- a) Has been continuously absent from work on the grounds of illness:
- b) Has been suffering from a chronic illness or disability which renders him or her unable to discharge his or her duties:
- c) Has exhausted all Sick Leave provided by Ordinance 6: in consultation with the Clinical Director or the equivalent Officer shall initiate the procedure set out in Appendix XX to determine whether Medical Boarding is the most appropriate action. Details of the procedure to be followed where it has been determined that Medical Boarding is appropriate are also contained in Appendix XX. Medical Boarding Procedure for Members of Academic Staff, Senior Administrative Staff and Professional Staff, Clause 194.
