Since the inception of the Joe Pereira Scholarship in 2004, the award has been presented to deserving students from various disciplines. This year's awardee is Ms. Sudean Peters who is pursuing a Bachelor of Arts in Journalism in the Faculty of Humanities and Education. Miss Peters hails from the parish of Clarendon and is a past student of Glenmuir High School where she completed her secondary education with 9 passes in CSEC and passes in 8 units of the CAPE examinations. Ms. Peter's is set to continue her sterling academic performance as she made the Dean's list in the last academic year.

In her acceptance of the scholarship Miss Peters expressed her gratitude for the opportunity, as the funds

will allow her to focus on her studies instead of worrying about her financial obligations to the University. She stands ready to represent WIGUT as its ambassador for this academic year.

In addition to the Joe Pereira Scholarship WIGUT has also disbursed the sum of \$1,080,000 in general bursaries to assist 27 students along their journey this academic year. These bursaries are as a result of members' contribution to the Bursary Fund and we encourage members to continue their support of this worthy cause. Special Bursaries named after past members who have given sterling contribution to WIGUT, will also be awarded.

As the region continues to offer support towards the rebuilding of the islands of The Bahamas in the wake of recent hurricanes, WIGUT (JA) registered its support by way of a cheque in the sum of US\$5,000.

During the month of October WIGUT also contributed \$25,000 towards the activities of the Institute of Gender and Development Studies to mark 16 Days of activism in support of International Day of Violence Against Women at the event dubbed "Walk a Mile in My Shoes.

Conditions Governing Annual Leave Entitlements (Clause 114) Appendix XIII page 18-20

Graduated Annual Leave and Maximum Accumulable

No. of years of service	Annual leave (working days)	Maximum accumulable
[New employees] 15 years and under	15 days per annum	30 days
Over 15-25	20 days per annum	40 days
Over 25	30 days per annum	60 days

Persons who are not new employees shall be entitled to 42 days Annual Leave per annum. Such persons include individuals who received a series of one-year contracts which began before 12th October, 2007 and thus had been in receipt of 42 days Annual Leave per annum.

New employees: Staff employed from 1st August 2009 Old employees: Staff employed before 31st July 2009

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UWI Awards Excellence in Teaching on Quality Day, 2019

The UWI Student Evaluation of Teaching Award Ceremony



After years of discussion, the first ever UWI Student Evaluation of Teaching (SET) award ceremony was held on Thursday, November 14, 2019 at 5:00 pm in the Exhibition Room, Faculty of Medical Sciences, Teaching and Research Complex. This award ceremony came about as a result of the partnership between the Office of the Deputy Principal and the Centre for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (CETL). It was fittingly held on the observation of Quality Day 2019, the first ever such observation at the UWI. The message was unmistakably clear, good teaching is one of the contributory factors to the quality offerings of the UWI.

Over the years, the need for the recognition of faculty who scored high on the SET was expressed by several senior managers and others at the UWI, Mona Campus. Unfortunately, this was not realised until on Thursday November 14, 2019 when this ceremony was held. The ceremony had as its chair, Professor Ian Boxill, Deputy Principal of the UWI Mona Campus.

Eighty four members of faculty were honoured for excellence in teaching (as was reflected in their SET scores) in this award ceremony. The list of awardees included professors, senior lecturers, lecturers and adjunct lecturers. They were drawn from five of the six faculties operating on the UWI Mona Campus (Faculty of Humanities and Education, Faculty of Social Sciences, Faculty of Medical Sciences, Faculty of Engineering and Faculty of Science and Technology). The awards were presented by Professor Dale Webber and Dr Tomlin Paul.



The chairman, in his opening remarks congratulated the awardees (faculty scoring 4.5 and above on SET) on their accomplishments and underscored the importance of teaching at the UWI Mona Campus. He indicated that the faculty who had worked long and hard in preparing for their classes and teaching in outstanding ways were definitely an asset to the institution. Hence, they were singled out for this special honour in the ceremony. He later pledged that the ceremony would not be a "one off event" but would be celebrated next year, in a bigger and more impressive ceremony.

Greetings were also brought by the Campus Principal, Professor Dale Webber. He congratulated the faculty for their stellar achievements and pledged the commitment of the Campus in recognising faculty pedagogical excellence. He noted that the ceremony was an historic one and congratulated the CETL and the Office of the Deputy Principal for working together to make the award ceremony a reality.

Dr Tomlin Paul, Dean of the Faculty of Medical Sciences and the UWI/Guardian Life Premium Teaching awardee for 2006 also brought greetings. He used the opportunity to congratulate the faculty on their award.
