

#### Health Care at UWI - COVID 19

2020 has presented us unprecedented challenges. We are six months into a pandemic that initially was ignored, discredited and camouflaged, unnecessarily worsening today's chaos.

COVID 19 has unmasked who we truly are as a people. This unmasking is no different for The University of the West Indies and by extension the University Health Centre, which has been under-resourced for many years. The effects of COVID 19 now dictate:

- 1. That the best infectious disease protocols be enforced to protect staff and patients.
- 2. Frequent hand washing for all, and sanitizing of hands when soap and water are not easily accessible.
- 3. Social distancing at all times.
- Wearing of masks and other Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for staff and users of this facility.

To ignore these four tenets of response will surely lead to sickness and maybe death. Therefore, the delivery of health care had to quickly change.

Crowding in a small space waiting to access health care is now a thing of the past. Patients should try to communicate by telephone with health care personnel to make appointments and to request the refilling of prescriptions. This is a better option than walking in as once the physical capacity for waiting patients is reached, others will have to wait outside.

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- All users of the Health Centre must wear masks and stand or sit six feet from each other at all times. Sanitizing of hands and temperature checks form part of the entry protocol.
- We encourage patients to enter the facility without accompanying family members or friends. This will only be allowed if needed.
- Patients suspected of having COVID 19 will be seen in a separate area and referred to another facility if indicated.
- The cleaning of the facility is now being done throughout the day instead of twice daily.

An increase in mental health issues forms a major part of the challenges associated with COVID 19 infection. Mental health providers at the University Health Centre now deliver mental health counselling and intervention mainly by telephone and via virtual platforms. Face-toface care in this area of health care has been reduced by 95%. All telephone numbers for the University Health Centre and all medical and counselling providers have been posted on the University's COVID 19 website.



#### **New Members Lyme**

The Membership Committee kicked off a series of events geared at welcoming new members to WIGUT (Jamaica), and to introduce the Executive Committee. This event took place on March 5, 2020, on the patio of the Open Learning Centre, the Open Campus. It commenced with opening remarks from Ms. Dayna Smith, followed by a welcome extended to all by Mr. Kirk Mullings, Chair, Membership Committee. He then invited General Secretary, Ms McKenzie, to bring greetings. She took the opportunity to extend an apology for absence on behalf of the President, Professor Paul Brown and the Senior Industrial Relations Officer, Mr. Carl Pilgrim. In attendance were 12 new members, and 13 members of the Executive along with Membership Committee members.

All attendees were asked to briefly introduce themselves, with a special request to the new members to indicate their area of interest/skill. They were given a short synopsis of the committees and encouraged to join any of these committees. Ms. Smith then posed questions to the new members in a brief quiz, and Misses Margarene Spence and Britta Hay were the lucky winners of a WIGUT branded cup, each. Refreshments were then served, amidst music and mingling of attendees.

#### WIGUT Special General Meeting Goes Virtual May 26, 2020

Constitutionally the Annual General Meeting of WIGUT (Jamaica) shall be held no later than April 30th every year. In the face of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Disaster Risk Management Act stipulates that no more than 10 persons can convene in any place to safeguard persons from the risk of exposure to the virus. The Act specifically states that persons should be 6 feet apart, to be socially distant. As such the AGM which was being planned for April 29, was not held, as the number of membership expected to attend the AGM would normally exceed 200. A special General Meeting to discuss the next step in planning for the AGM was called for May 26, 2020, to take a decision on whether to postpone or cancel the AGM in the face of the uncertainty.

The Special General Meeting was held for the first time virtually using Zoom, with the President Professor Paul Brown and other Executive members in a virtual room, and

broadcasting through YouTube for the general membership to participate with questions and comments. The meeting was facilitated and coordinated by MITS. Approximately, 207 members were in attendance at this meeting and discussions were vibrant with guestions ranging from how to effect changes to the Constitution to include meetings via online platforms, to choosing a suitable time frame for holding the AGM, as well as safety measures being discussed by the Government, social distancing protocols and responding to Management's call for contributions to the campus in the face of the financial crisis now facing the UWI amidst this pandemic. A highlight of the meeting was a presentation by Professor Hubert Devonish on funding the UWI amidst the pandemic. Members were asked to vote via an online poll on whether to postpone or cancel the AGM for this period given the current situation. 
